## 2010-11 Funding Areas & Programs

### **Adult & Child Rehab Center (0010)**

Provides outpatient physical, occupational, and speech therapies for clients ranging from children to seniors and home health care including Nursing care and some therapies.

### **Big Brothers Big Sisters (0020)**

Youth companion and mentoring program that matches volunteers and at-risk youth to develop positive relationships that have a direct impact on the live of your people.

### **Boy Scouts - Blackhawk Area Council (0030)**

Youth development program that builds character, teaches the responsibilities of participating citizenship, and develops personal fitness by combining education activities and lifelong values with fun.

### **CASA of McHenry County (0040)**

Volunteers advocate for abused and neglected children to help them find safe, permanent homes where they can thrive, making a life-long difference for children.

### **Catholic Charities (0050)**

Programs include individual and family counseling services, bilingual outreach services, and physician referral for everyone, regardless of race, religion, ethnicity or ability to pay.

### **Child Advocacy Center (0060)**

Advocates for victims of abuse help by coordinating the activities of the agencies involved in the investigation, prosecution and treatment referral for the children.

### **Community Action Agency (0070)**

Head Start provides a comprehensive developmental preschool program for children age 3-5 years that includes health, dental, nutrition, social services and parental education for low-income families.

### **Consumer Credit Counseling Service (0080)**

Promotes financial responsibility through counseling, education and money management services including financial counseling and advice, debt reduction programs, bankruptcy education and mortgage foreclosure prevention.

### **Faith In Action (0090)**

Assisting seniors in maintaining independence by providing no-cost volunteer services including transportation, friendly visits, housekeeping, yard raking, minor home maintenance, shopping and respite care.

### **Family Alliance (0100)**

Services to help mentally and/or physically fragile elderly stay at home that include day programming, advocacy, counseling and caregiver respite, education, training and support.

### **Family Health Partnership Clinic (0110)**

Quality primary and specialty health care services to the uninsured and underinsured through a committed group of volunteer physicians, nurses and a dedicated staff.

### **Family Service & Community Mental Health Center (0120)**

Outpatient mental health and substance abuse counseling services for all ages, including prevention, crisis intervention, and case management.

### **Friendship House (0130)**

A DCFS licensed childcare facility providing day care in a nurturing environment rich in developmentally appropriate activities to children 6 weeks to 12 years.

### **Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois (0140)**

Provides opportunities for girls ages 5-17 to develop leadership skills and self-esteem through age-specific activities, while they discover their personal best and prepare for a positive future.

### **Home of the Sparrow (0150)**

Transitional housing and supportive services from women with children, single women and pregnant women who are homeless.

### **Hospice of Northeastern Illinois (0160)**

Hospice care and bereavement services including comprehensive personal and pastoral care, pain and symptom management, and education to those coping with loss and end-of-life.

### **Light Center Foundation (0170)**

Equine and Animal-assisted services for challenged and at-risk youth including educational, recreational, and therapeutic services that are especially useful in mental health and delinquency intervention.

### **Not-for-Profit Resources (0180)**

Provides a comprehensive database of all volunteer opportunities within greater McHenry County.

### **Pioneer Center for Human Services (0190)**

Job placement and coaching services for people with disabilities. Services for homeless persons including day program, transportation, and transitional housing services. Delinquency prevention and intervention and substance abuse treatment and prevention through counseling, social work, and education services to enhance the quality of life for children, youth, and families.

### **Prairie State Legal Services (0200)**

Civil legal services including legal advice and court representation to resolve critical disputes and secure basic needs for the elderly, the disabled, victims of abuse, and low-income families.

### **The Salvation Army (0210)**

Services include emergency food, shelter, clothing, some rent and utility assistance and after-school community center providing recreation and education resources for children K-8th grade.

### **The Salvation Army Golden Diners (0220)**

Senior nutrition program that provides nutrition education and low-cost meals either at their dining centers or home delivered for homebound person 60 years of age and better.

### **Senior Services Associates (0230)**

Senior services including case management, caregiver respite, transportation, health, nursing home ombudsman, recreation, 24-hour crisis services, and senior companion program.

### **Turning Point (0240)**

Domestic violence services including 24-hour crisis intervention, response, and emergency shelter, legal and non-legal advocacy, individual and group counseling and partner abuse prevention.

### **USO of Illinois (0250)**

Support for U.S. troops and their families through services including social, recreational, entertainment and educational programs and support services.

### **Woodstock Early Learning Center (0260)**

A DCFS licensed childcare facility providing day care in a nurturing environment rich in developmentally appropriate activities and before and after school care to children 6 weeks to 12 years.

### **YMCA of McHenry County (0270)**

Programs include before and after school care and summer day care for school age children and grants offered to other United Way partner agency clients in need of YMCA programs.
